When circumstances indicate that <u>subject-based acceleration and/or</u> acceleration in grade placement is in the best interest of the <u>a</u> student, the student will be referred to the <u>campus Student Assistance Team (SAT)</u>, or to the IEP team for students in special education. (A SAT may not make educational decisions for a student once he or she is <u>placed in special education.</u>)

<u>A SAT team includes the student's teacher, school counselor, school administrator, the</u> <u>student's parent, and the student as deemed appropriate</u>. <u>close cooperation between the</u> <u>parents and all school personnel involved is imperative</u>. Each student will <u>have be given</u> individual consideration <u>by the SAT or IEP team</u>, and <u>a</u> decisions <u>regarding whether or</u> <u>not subject-based acceleration is appropriate for a student</u> will be made only after a careful study of facts relating to the student's growth and development. The student's academic achievement level and mental ability are important, but physical and social characteristics <del>are</del> <u>must</u> also <del>determining factors</del> <u>be taken into consideration</u>. <del>A</del> <u>The</u> decision <del>should be</del> <u>must be</u> based on <del>sufficient <u>a</u> variety of</del> data collected over a period of time and motivated by a desire to place the student in the school program where <u>the SAT</u> <u>or IEP team believes</u> the greatest <del>success</del> <u>benefit for the student</u> will <del>result</del> <u>be realized</u>.

The final decision to offer a student subject-based or grade to accelerate a student acceleration rests with the Superintendent SAT or IEP team. However, the parent must be in agreement with the decision, and must provide prior written consent to the acceleration. Parental involvement in all steps of the process is vital. Parental consent to the acceleration of a student should be in writing.

If parents do not approve of a decision If a parent disagrees with the SAT or IEP team recommendation regarding the acceleration of the student, they may appeal the decision to the Superintendent. Further appeal, if necessary, may be made to the Board. the school should be notified in writing. The notification will be maintained in either the student's cumulative file or in the student's special education file at the district special education office.
