<u>Environmental Department:</u> (All information below is based on the food code and NM Environment Health Department)

Food handler certification:

- Who needs: Anyone that is a food employee will need certification. Food employee defined as- "an individual working with unpackaged food, food equipment, food utensils, or food contact surfaces"
 - Any organization/entity dealing with the 3 high susceptible populations:
 preschool aged children, elderly and people with weakened immune systems
 must be certified
 - Culinary classes that are used to cater events/celebrations for persons other than themselves must be certified.
 - Classes that have staff that handle/serve food to students, personnel must be certified.
- Need to be certified 30 days after employment, if do not have certification at time of employment
- Certification good for 3yrs from time received

Snack bars/events: The "person in charge" if food handler certified is the only one needing certification but must be present the whole length of event/celebration.

Temporary Permits: applications are to be sent to: permit.applications@state.nm.us or can be faxed to (575)526-6162

- **Needed when:** Must be turned in prior to event with enough time to allow Environment department (EID) to review for approval. Please give yourself time as EID has 10 days to review application.
 - Environmental department request that temporary permit application be filled out and sent in anytime food items will be sold-once reviewed decision will be made if temporary permit or priority 2 approval is needed.
 - Serving or selling any food packaged or unpackaged that needs Time and Temperature control to keep it safe.
 - If food items will be sold at an event/celebration/fundraiser for 3 days or more in a calendar month there will be a \$25 fee for the temporary permit.
 - o For one time events there is no charge, but application must be submitted.
