I am pleased to inform you that the request your district submitted did receive priority for funding for the **Elementary Physical Education Program.**

Eight million dollars (\$8,000,000) was appropriated during the 2007 legislative session for the Elementary Physical Education Program through the State Equalization Guarantee (SEG). In addition to the appropriation in House Bill 2, House Bill 208 (HB 208), SCHOOL PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS & COSTS was also passed. HB 208 provides specific language and direction to the Public Education Department (PED) for establishing eligibility criteria for the sites to be funded for the elementary physical education program.
