

For December 8, 2022

	sustainable and green manufacturing. What innovations or developments could be produced to foster our schools, jobs and
	communities?" Each of the following students will receive a \$500 reward.

- E. Student Representative-Briana Hernandez, a sophomore from Alta Vista Early College High School, reported that this week they have been taking the DACC finals and next week will have high school finals. The Alta Vista media students will be competing in the Business Professionals of America regional on January 10th at Arrowhead Park Early College High School. Students are competing in 10 different events, some of which are individual competitions, such as Digital Media Production and Graphic Design Promotion, while others are team events, such as Podcast Production Team and Visual Design Team. We wish them good luck. Last month, seniors took their cap and gown pictures and had advising with DACC to select their classes for their last semester. Juniors continue their volunteering partnership with Berino Elementary. They thanked Mrs. Carnevale, again, for the opportunity to volunteer on her campus and make a difference in the lives of young students. Brandi Apodaca (a 2020 graduate of Alta Vista Early College High School and former District Student Leadership Council member) is continuing her internship on our campus and providing our students with guidance from her experience as a student at AVECHS. They are excited to continue the school clubs and organizations such as Chess Club, Science Club, and National Honor Society. The Academic Counselor, Ms. Angel, has begun her recruiting process for the 2023-2024 school year. Last week she and a few seniors visited each middle school. The seniors presented to the 8th graders and were able to answer any questions they had. There were 216 students who signed up with interest in attending Alta Vista Early College High School. They had 76 from Chaparral Middle School, 69 from Gadsden Middle School, and 71 from Santa Teresa Middle School. The application process is online and they have received 26 applications so far. Eleven from Chaparral, 7 from Gadsden, and 8 from Santa Teresa. The maximum number of students that can be accepted is 66 and the deadline to apply is January 13th. All application information is located on the school website under the Admissions link. They look forward to reviewing the applications and selecting their incoming Mighty Owl Freshmen

students! On Tuesday they had an 8th Grade Virtual Parent Meeting to provide information to the parents about their school and the application process. They had 48 parents that attended the virtual meeting.

Monthly Budget Report For The Month Ended October 31, 2022 10. Discussion Items:

- A. Mrs. Cadena, Associate Superintendent for Support Services, presented information on the Grant of Utility Easement to Camino Real Regional Utility Authority.
- B. Mrs. Cadena presented information on the Student Nutrition Program Survey Results.
- C. Mr. Wohlgemuth, Director for Secondary Schools, presented information on the 2023-24 School Calendar.
- D. Superintendent Dempsey presented information on the Possible Consolidation of Sunland Park Elementary with Desert View Elementary and Riverside Elementary. He explained that Sunland Park Elementary (SPE) has experienced a significant enrollment decline along with decreases in enrollment across the district. Desert View Elementary is located close to Sunland Park Elementary and has adequate space for these students which would create cost savings for the district. On Tuesday December 6, 2022, he discussed this with the staff assigned to SPE and allowed them to share their input and thoughts. Community meeting is scheduled for Tuesday December 13, 2022, at Sunland Park Elementary at 4:30 pm.
- E. Superintendent Dempsey presented information on the Possible Consolidation of Mesquite Elementary with North Valley Elementary and Vado Elementary. He explained that Mesquite Elementary (MQE) has experienced a significant enrollment decline along with decreases in enrollment across the district. North Valley Elementary and Vado Elementary are located close to MQE and have adequate space for these students which would create cost savings for the district. On Tuesday January 10, 2023, he would like to meet with the staff assigned to MQE and allow them to share their input and thoughts. Community meeting tentatively scheduled for Tuesday January 17, 2023, at MQE.
- F. Superintendent Dempsey presented information on the Board Norms.
- G. Superintendent Dempsey presented information on the Finance Committee: Understanding Purpose.
- H. Mrs. Martinez presented information on the Monthly Budget Report For The Month Ended October 31, 2022.
